Second Son Killed

During the weekend, for the second time in less than three months, Mrs. Mary Pluebel, of Moshannon, received word from the War Department of the death of a son.

Pfc. Richards Missing

A War Department message received during the weekend by Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Richards, of Prossertown, reported that their son, Pfc. James R. Richards, 19, has been missing in action in France since October 28.

Pfc. Richards was a member of the 197th Infantry under General Patton. He was called for service April 17, 1943, and at New Cumberland was assigned to Camp Blanning, Fla., to begin training.

Later he was sent to Camp Robinson, Ark., where after 11 months further training he spent a four-month home leave. Two hours after returning to Camp Robinson, he left for Camp Rucker, Ala., and a month later was sent to Ft. Meade, Md. He went overseas early last July, landing in France.

His last letter home, received November 4, in part: "Well, I got myself five Jerrys and I have a Jerry wrist watch. I can't write much because I have to be on the lookout for the Germans."

Pfc. Richards was a junior at Bellefonte High School when called for service. He formerly carried newspapers in the Prossertown vicinity.

Cpl. Lambert Prisoner

Cpl. Edwin M. Lambert, son of Mrs. Nellie Lambert of Milesburg, and husband of the former Marie Gross of Bellefonte, is a prisoner of war in Germany, according to a card from him received by his wife.

On the prisoner of war card written in his own handwriting it said: "Fine health and will be moved shortly to another camp and will not be able to write for a while."

Cpl. Lambert took part in D-Day invasion of France and it is believed at the time he was reported missing that he was taking part in the capture of St. Lo. He was with a medical detachment of the infantry.

The Milesburg soldier, who attended Bellefonte High School and who was employed by the Universal Match Company at the time of entering service, was called into the Army in October, 1942. He took infantry training at Camp Blanning, Fla., Nashville, Tenn., and after a stay at Camp Atterbury, Ind., was sent overseas last February.

His last furlough home was during last Christmas time. His wife lives with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edward C. Cox of Valentine street, Bellefonte. A brother, Pfc. Harry Lambert, is also overseas.

Pvt. Kizer Dies From Wounds

Private Clark Kizer, 22, a son of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Kizer, of Osceola Mills, died from wounds received in action in Holland, on October 4.

The young paratrooper had been seriously wounded on that same day, and despite every medical attention, failed to respond to treatment. No immediate details were learned.

Private Kizer volunteered for service last December, joining the paratroopers. He went overseas in August, and almost immediately was assigned hazardous action, moving into Holland when the paratroop division was ordered to launch the all important offensive in that country.

He is survived by his wife, his parents at Osceola Mills, and eleven brothers and sisters.
