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Sunday School Lesson

THE CHRISTIAN'S VIEW OF INDUSTRY

International Sunday School Lesson for November 26, 1944.

GOLDEN TEXT: "Let him that stole steal no more; but rather let him labour, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have to give him that needeth."—Ephesians 4: 28.

Lesson Text: Luke 19: 15-26; Thessalonians 3: 10-12.

So closely related are various individual and social problems to the earning and spending of money that it is certainly proper that this lesson be included in our quest for light from Christ on life's problems today.

In the larger scriptural background suggested for this lesson is a passage from Deuteronomy, in which Moses exhorts the children of Israel to fidelity to God on the grounds of God's abundant blessings to them, and a warning to them about the perils of prosperity.

Moses' warning to the Israelites is needed today. When people prosper in the material things of the world, they are tempted to forget their dependence upon God.

Contrary to the beliefs of some people, the Bible and the teachings of Jesus do not discourage the accumulating of material possessions.

Bellefonte Council granted the borough dog law enforcement officer's request for an increase in pay, Monday night.

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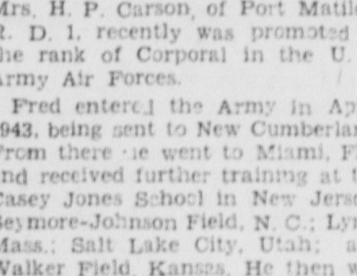
Receives Promotion
