Spring Mills Flier Bombs Jap Freighter in Pacific

Despite heavy and accurate anti-aircraft fire, Lieut. (jg) John R. Zubler, of Spring Mills, plane commander of a Navy Black Cat, scored two bomb hits on a 3,000-ton Jap freighter during a recent mission in the southern Celebes.

Machine-gun and 20-millimeter hits holded the fuselage and severed a control cable of the Black Cat as it came in on its run but had no effect on Lt. Zuber's bombing aim. His eggs landed amidship, causing heavy damage. On another recent mission, this time over Davao Gulf, southern Philippines, the Black Cat bombed and strafed nine small freighters.

U. S. ARMY HAS ROBOT BOMB TO USE IF IT'S EVER NEEDED

The Army Air Forces disclosed it had developed a "good" robot bomb that could be used "if we need it" and said the weapon had been in test flight since October 11.
