Sgt. Dana was born in Bellefonte, September 9, 1918, while his father

was serving in France during the first World War. His mother is the former Frances Novosel of Bellefonte. In addition to his parents and grandparents, the following brothers and sisters survive: Mrs. Robert Kellerman, of Millersburg; Caroline, Eugene, Mary, Rose and Anthony, all at home.

Pfc. Moerschbacher Killed
Pfc. Cyril Moerschbacher, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Cyril Moerschbacher, of the Nittany Country Club,

Hecla, was killed in action on December 2 in Germany. It was revealed in a War Department message received Tuesday by his parents. Pfc. Moerschbacher observed his 30th birthday on November 16. The county soldier, who was serving in the infantry, entered the service on March 19, 1943, and received his training as a cook at Camp Polk, La. He was sent to England in June, this year, and is believed to have been sent into France about a month ago.

He was home on furlough before being sent overseas.
He was born in Bellefonte on November 20, 1924, and attended the parochial school here. During the summer months he served as a caddy at the Nittany Country Club and was deeply interested in music. Surviving, in addition to his father, who is steward at the Country Club, and his mother, the former Olive Howard, are two brothers and three sisters: Sgt. William Moerschbacher, with the armed forces in England; Frank and Agnes Moersch-

bacher, both at home; Mrs. Mary Ishler, of Emporium, and Mrs. Lloyd Cummings, of Bellefonte.

Pvt. Wenrick Wounded
Pvt. Irvin W. Wenrick, 33, of Snow Shoe, was slightly wounded on November 11 in Germany, his wife, the former Eleanor Stock, of Snow Shoe, was informed by a War Department message received last Wednesday.
Pvt. Wenrick was with an armored infantry group known as the "Roosevelt Butchers." He was called for service April 5 of this year and after training at Ft. McClellan, Ala., was sent to Ft. Meade, Md., and left for overseas in September. He served in Italy and France before going into Germany.

Pfc. Crestoni, who made his home with the Carra family since the death of his mother in May, 1935, was called for service July 14, 1942, and was assigned to the infantry.
The Clarence soldier first trained at Camp Forrest, Tenn., then at Nashville, Tenn., and spent some time at a camp near Los Angeles, Cal. In July of this year he was sent overseas.
Pfc. Crestoni attended the Clarence schools and was employed in the coal mines in that area for about a year before entering service.

Pfc. Fisher Wounded
A War Department telegram received Saturday by Mr. and Mrs. Toner Fisher of Wingate, informed them that their son, Pfc. Russell Fisher, 28, had been wounded for the second time in slightly over four months in the European war theater.
Saturday's message stated that he was slightly wounded in action in Germany on November 30. Early last August the Fishers were notified that their son was wounded in Normandy, France, on July 25.
At that time he was shot through the right leg and remained in a hospital in England until November 1, when he was sent back into action first in Belgium and then Germany.

Pfc. Deitrich Wounded
Pfc. Leslie J. Deitrich, 24, was slightly wounded in action in Germany on December 4, according to a War Department telegram received yesterday morning by his mother, Mrs. Marie Eby, of near Zion.
Pfc. Deitrich entered service in January 1942 while he was employed at the Chevrolet Garage on West Bishop street, Bellefonte. He was assigned to the infantry and after undergoing training in this country was sent overseas in October 1942. He participated in the D-Day invasion of Normandy and afterwards was in a hospital for a time for treatment of an illness he contracted.

Cpl. Mardis Wounded
Cpl. Roy Mardis, 36, of Hecla Park, was seriously wounded on Leyte in the Philippines, it was reported last Thursday in a War Department message to his wife, the former Marion Miller of Hecla Park. He was wounded on November 12, the message indicated.
The Nittany Valley soldier, who was serving with an Observation Battalion, enlisted in the Army in June 1943, and first trained at Camp Bowie, Texas. Later he was sent on maneuvers at Shreveport, La., after which he spent a furlough at his home early this year. He was then sent to an embarkation point on the Pacific coast and late last summer landed somewhere in the Pacific.
