#### WAR PRODUCTION BOARD ORDERS A

# LIGHTING "BROWNOUT"

Nation's coal shortage at this critical time leads to Government Order prohibiting certain uses of electricity

Although there is no shortage of electricity, there is an urgent need to save coal and other scarce fuels used in generating electricity, as a part of the United States Government's over-all war time fuel conservation program.

Accordingly, the War Production Board has issued Utilities Order U-9 prohibiting some uses of electricity, effective February 1, 1945.

### Prohibited Uses

- Here are the prohibited uses: 1. Outdoor advertising and outdoor promotional lighting.
- 2. Outdoor display lighting except where necessary for the conduct of the business of outdoor establishments.
- 3. Outdoor decorative and outdoor ornamental lighting.
- 4. Show window lighting except where necessary for interior illumination.
- 5. Marquee lighting in excess of 60 watts for each marquee. White way street lighting in excess of the amount determined by local public authority to be necessary for public
- safety. 7. Outdoor sign lighting except for:
  - (i) Directional or identification signs required for fire and police protection, traffic control, transportation terminals or hospitals; or directional or identification signs for any similar essential public services the lighting of which is specifically certified to be necessary by local public authority.
  - (ii) Directional or identification signs using not more than 60 watts per establishment, for doctors and for hotels, and other public lodging establishments.

#### Compliance with Order

Persons not complying with the Order are subject to penalties prescribed by Federal Law which may include the discontinuance of electric service at the direction of the War Production Board. Under the terms of the Order we must report to the War Production Board the name and location of any customer who refuses to comply with the Order.

#### Don't Wait for February 1

In view of the critical war situation, you naturally will wish to comply fully with the Order. You are urged to put its provisions into effect at once. By starting now, you will have time to make any necessary adjustments so that you will be complying with the Order when it becomes effective Thursday, February 1, 1945.

#### Conserve Other Uses of Electricity

We urge you to conserve to the maximum other uses of electricity not prohibited by this Order. Turning out lights in unoccupied areas - disconnecting electric appliances when their use is not needed and similar measures all aid in conserving

the fuel so vital to the war effort.
