Your Red Cross—Home Service

The Rev. H. C. Carolus, home service chairman of the Bellefonte Chapter, American Red Cross, said recently that since the Korean War, Home Service to members of the Armed Forces and their families has increased 73 per cent. He also stated that since the war there has been an increase of 250 per cent in monthly financial help to servicemen and their families from American Red Cross Chapters all over the United States.

The American Red Cross program of service to the military is based upon demonstrated needs recognized by the military establishment. Field directors at military installations, working with the Chapters, serve the man and his family as a unit. The Red Cross program of service to the Armed Forces is conducted through three major service divisions—service at military installations, service in the military hospitals and home service in the Chapters.

These services include: home conditions reports and condition-of-the-patient reports to and from the Chapter; social, medical, or other specified data required by hospitals and facilities; notification concerning homecoming, convalescent furloughs, leaves, and discharges; financial assistance in the form of loans and grants where the need has been established; aid in counseling on servicemen's personal and family problems, and verification through doctors and other sources of the need of emergency furloughs due to illness or death at home.
