Lansford test the legality of the 20 per cent fee? John Mitchell, a Lansford councilman, suggests that Summit Hill pass an ordinance on the fee, so that Panther Valley can test the agreement in court. Summit Hill Council says Panther Valley TV should go ahead and test it.

The company says it is not its business to prove the agreement, and that Summit Hill should prove the deal legal.

Frank Llewellyn, Summit Hill solicitor, said in effect, "we want our \$100 but don't press the 20 per cent amusement fee question. Mitchell said "we're not interested in the \$100 fee—as a council. What we want to know is whether this 20 per cent 'tax' is going to be passed on to local residents."

Farrington was released under bond of \$1,500 put up by Lemuel G. Groce, of Castanea, for his appearance in the U. S. Court, June 8, 1948, to answer charges of operating the illegal still and planning to sell liquor without paying the Federal taxes. He did not appear for his hearing and the bond was forfeited. The case was continued and a nationwide search for Farrington was carried on. It lasted nearly three years, during which time "the Prince" was reported at various places, but most often in Florida. He is now being held in the Orange County jail at Orlando.
