Ward was shot last Wednesday by Night Watchman Remundus Angel after an argument on the grounds of the State Insane Asylum at Las Vegas where Ward is employed.

It was reported that Ward and another man were on their way to the kitchen to obtain food when the night watchman, who is being held in technical custody, ordered them to halt. An argument followed and Ward was shot.

Ward, whose mother, Mrs. Rosie Ward, lives in Prossertown, near Bellefonte, is an Army veteran who has made his home in Las Vegas since receiving his discharge. He is married and has three children.

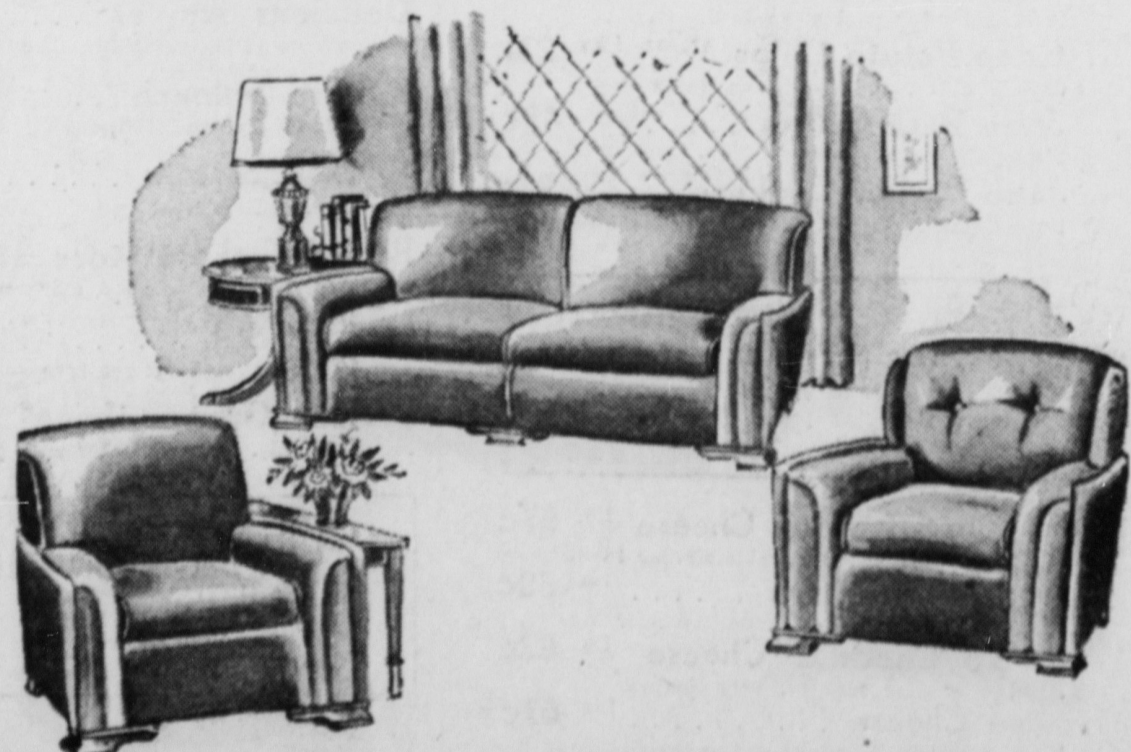
