These farmers are members of dairy herd improvement associations whose supervisors keep records of at 2 p. m. Friday with Rev. William how much milk and butterfat their cows produce, the value of that milk and cost of feeds the cows eat. Just now there is a shortage of supervisors, or cow testers as they are in Millheim from 7 to 9 p. m. known. For some dairymen it may mean a break in continuous records of 25 years or more unless someone can be found to do the work.
