Vacancies Await DHIA Supervisors

Many dairy farmers may not know if their cows are worth their feed unless some farm-reared boys or girls come to their rescue, according to County Agent L. H. Bull.

These farmers are members of dairy herd improvement associations whose supervisors keep records of how much milk and butterfat their cows produce, the value of that milk and cost of feeds the cows eat. Just now there is a shortage of supervisors, or cow testers as they are known. For some dairymen it may mean a break in continuous records of 25 years or more unless someone can be found to do the work.

Recently 18 men and nine women completed the two weeks' DHIA Supervisors' course for this work at Penn State. Still there were not enough candidates to fill all of the vacancies.

The next supervisors' training course will be May 9 to 23 at the College. Persons interested in this type of work are requested to get in touch with County Agent L. H. Bull at the County Agricultural Extension office in the post office at Bellefonte.

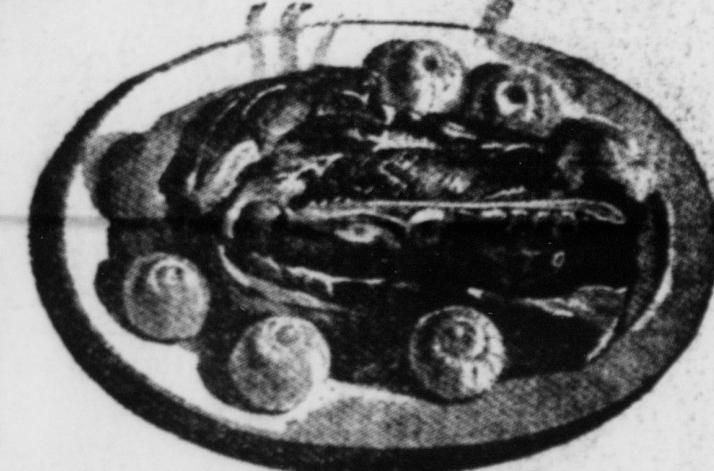
