Approximate cost would be \$45,000. Lights would cost \$30,000 but equipment at the Bellefonte airport might be used.

Centre County needs an airport because of the lack of adequate surface transportation. He told the group train service is 30 miles distant and the mountains make motor travel hazardous in winter months.

In financing, Mr. Leonard reported the Federal Government may now contribute up to 50 per cent of the cost of a site while the State Government may contribute up to 25 per cent of the cost of improvements.

It was understood Penn State might help with engineering work and might lease the land adjacent to the airport for agriculture studies.

Establishment of an airport would aid business, he pointed out. Air mail, air express and air cargo service is essential to any area, he believes.

The group decided to request Sherman Lutz, owner of the State College Air Depot, to present a written proposition on his holdings.

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday afternoon and Civil Aeronautics officials will be present to discuss several sites.

An Airport Committee from Penn State, headed by S. K. Hostetter, will be invited.
