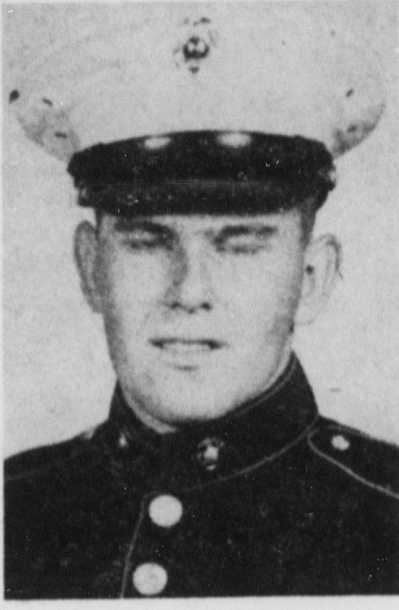

ARTICLE CITES CO. DAIRYMEN

Says New Pasturing Method Originated Here and Is Spreading

Pioneering Centre county dairymen have developed a new pasturing operation that has spread to half a dozen other states and promises to be made a model for dairy farms throughout the Northeast.

The April issue of Country Gentleman tells the story of the pasture's development in an article entitled "High-Yield, Hot-Weather Pasture," by Alfred H. Sinks.

Centre county farmers have worked out a variation of the so-called Hohenheim system of rotation grazing and are using a combination of orchard grass and ladino clover, Sinks writes. The mixture, once established, "produces the highest quality cow feed at the lowest possible cost," Sinks says.

That low-cost feature is, where increased dairy profits come in—that and the fact that these ladino-orchard grass pastures grow steadily right through the hot, dry midsummer stretch when most pastures are lying down crying for help," he continues.

In developing the method, farmers in the region "grabbed the ball from the experts and ever since then the experts have been getting many of their pointers from the farmers," says the article.

The old Hohenheim rotation grazing system is one that experts discarded many years ago as impractical and the orchard grass is stuff that has been a sore problem for many another farmer.

The idea has spread to Ohio, Kentucky, Virginia, Maryland, Connecticut and New Hampshire.

County dairymen cited in the article are Clarence Beck of Stormstown, James Beaver of Bellefonte, Phil Stover of Zion, and Ellis Reacker of Millheim. Mr. Sinks worked with the county agent's office while preparing the story.

State Police and Cambria county Coroner Joseph Govekas, who are conducting an investigation, said there was no curve at the point of the accident, the highway was dry and no mechanical defects were found on the machine. Fink will be questioned by State Police to determine the cause of the accident.
