Marble Tournament Set Next Wednesday

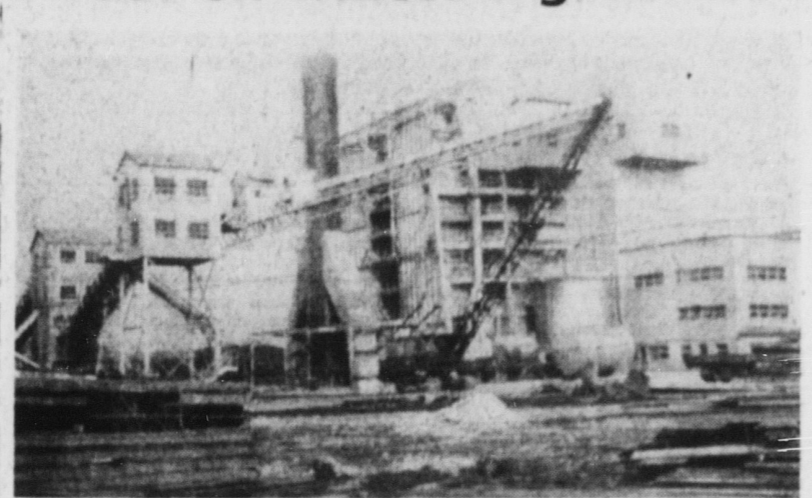

Building of Power Plant Has Effect on Milesburg Status

M-Sgt Wm. King Wounded 2nd Time

Master Sgt. William G. King, formerly of Pine Glenn, has been wounded for the second time in action in Korea, according to word received by his wife, Mrs. Kathryn King, of Coleville.

A telegram from the Defense Department stated that he was wounded late in March. His name appeared on the official casualty list released Sunday.

In a letter to his mother, Mrs. Lucy King, of Pine Glenn, he said that he had received wounds in one leg above the knee. He is now in a hospital.

M-Sgt. King was wounded first Nov. 23, 1950, and spent seven days in the hospital.

He served in the Army during World War II and had served three years in January. He was working in Niagara Falls, N. Y., when he re-enlisted.

He is the fifth Centre County soldier reported on the casualty lists as wounded since December.

Mrs. King and their three children live in Coleville.

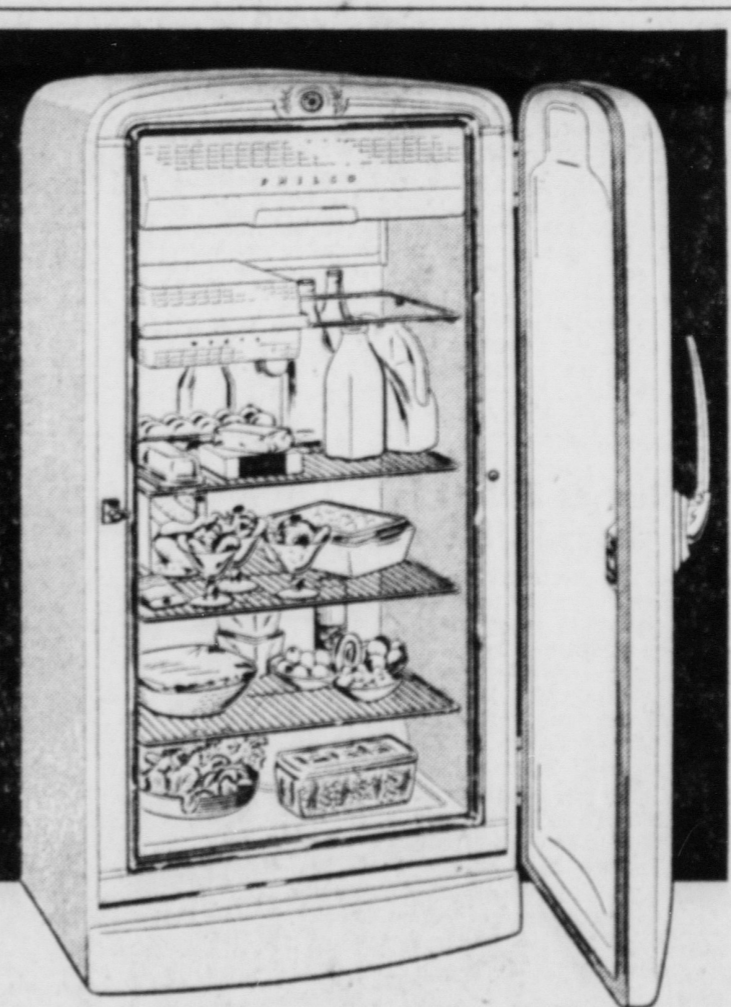
