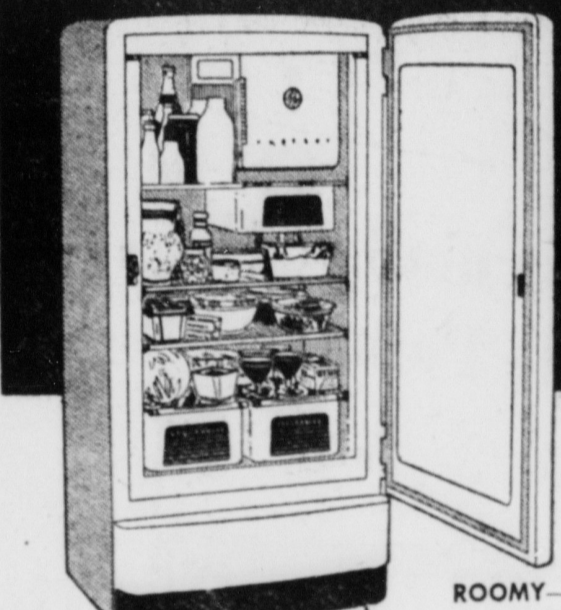

Guest soloists for the meeting will be Mrs. Elizabeth Vincent, of Lock Haven, and Andrew Fontana, of Lock Haven. They will be accompanied by Mrs. Vincent's mother, Mrs. Olive Silver, also of Lock Haven.

Mrs. Vincent, until a few years ago, was a resident of New York City, is the daughter of Baron Paul de Launay, composer and concert organist of Florida, formerly of Paris, and Olive Silver, of Lock Haven, who has been her daughter's only voice teacher.

Mrs. Vincent, soprano, has sung under the baton of the late Sandro Benelli, originator of the Floritine Choir, and Solon Alberti, organist and director in New York City. Twice a winner of the Associated Concert Bureau's nationwide auditions in New York City, Mrs. Vincent is now soloist at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Lock Haven, and appears with an ensemble over radio station WRPZ.

Mr. Fontana, baritone, has been director of the Immaculate Conception Choir in Lock Haven for the last three years. He has been a student in New York City under Giuseppe Radelli, teacher with the Salmaggi Opera Company, and St. Peter's Church Choir in Washington, D.C. Mr. Fontana is a native of the Austrian Tyrol.

Both Mrs. Vincent and Mr. Fontana were winners of auditions and appeared together as guest soloists at the Williamsport Symphony Society concert last year.
