Work Done In The Zion Home Group

The Home Economics Extension group from Zion had variety in their meeting this year. Instead of concentrating on one project there were four meeting, each completely different.

The first meeting was on house cleaning where an inexpensive wall paper cleaner and furniture polish was made to really do the job. Anther meeting that was very satisfactory was on making cake and biscuit mixes. These turned out to be very economical and just as good as you buy. The last meeting was a demonstration by Miss Butler on putting hems in dresses by machine instead of by the old hand method, and making shoulder pads.

The meeting on refinishing furniture was an all day meeting. Several who attended took pieces of furniture to the home of a neighbor where the many layers of paint and varnish were removed. Once down to solid wood, the finishing material, made at home, was rubbed in. One chair had a design on the back that had been covered with about four layers of paint. This was drawn off as a pattern to go by when the chair was repainted and ready to have the design re-

These pieces of furniture, along with projects done by other groups of Centre County, probably will be displayed at the spring Homemaker's Day, May 16, at Pleasant Gap Grange Hall, to celebrate National Home Demonstration Week


