Time To Spray For Spittle Bug

For the first time large numbers of farmers will be spraying to control spittlebug on clover and alfalfa.

According to County Agent L. H. Bull, the nymphs are starting to hatch and stands of clover and alfalfa should be sprayed during the week of May 7.

Mr. Bull reminds farmers to use liquid forms of insecticides for weed type sprayers to cut down nozzle trouble in spraying.

One of the following materials should be used at the rate of one quart per acre.

Benzene Hexachloride 10% gamma toxaphene about 45% (4 lbs. per gal).

Chlordane, about 45% emulsion. Mr. Bull stated about 30 gallons of spray should be used to be most effective. He also stated that farmers should leave an unsprayed area so that results can be compared.

Call or write to the Agricultural Extension Office in Bellefonte and ask for a free copy of Leaflet 144, Spittle Bug Control on Alfalfa and Clover, farmers were advised.

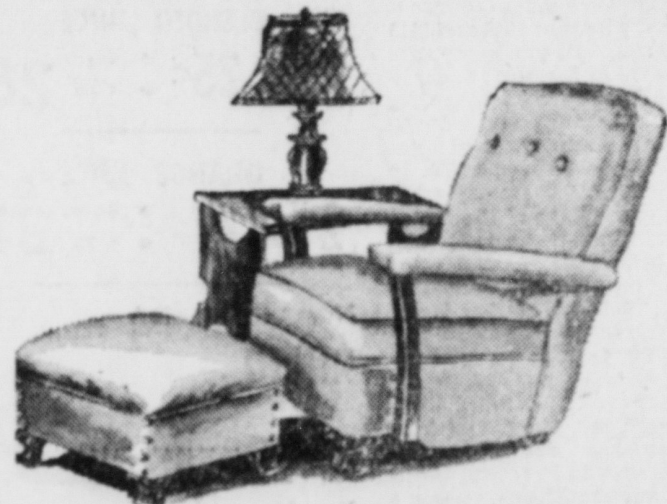
