James is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Grove, of Spring Mills, and is a member of the senior class of the Gregg Township Vocational School.

Band: Raymond Witherite, alto horn; Donald Duck, trumpet; Ward Hill, clarinet; Logan Hill, trumpet; Larry Shook, cornet, and Gene Haugh, bass. Two other members, Harold Wolfe and Fred Zerby, will be contestants in the Dairy Judging Contest.
