FARM CALENDAR

Timely Reminders From The Pennsylvania State College School of Agriculture
INSPECT WIRING SYSTEM—The electrical system in your home or on your farm is no stronger than its poorest part, reminds C. H. Eingham, extension agricultural engineer. He urges periodical inspection of wiring systems by a qualified person. Repairs and replacements should be made promptly where needed.
GROW ASPARAGUS—Either Mary Washington or Martha Washington is a good asparagus variety, reminds J. O. Dutt, Penn State extension vegetable specialist. He recommends one-year plants, 67 of them in a 100-foot row for the average sized family.
MANAGE MILKING—The average cow can be milked in three minutes if the dairyman uses the managed milking method advocated by Ivan E. Parkin, extension dairy specialist of the Pennsylvania State College.
CONTROL FLEA BEETLES—A 1 per cent rotenone dust may be used to control flea beetles on vegetable leaves to be used as greens or on other edible portions of vegetables to be used within 30 days, reminds Stanley Gesell, Penn State extension entomologist.
PLAN THE PLANTING—If you are planning to plant a few shrubs or trees on the home grounds this year, remember that the specimens are young and will grow. A. O. Rasmussen, extension ornamental horticulturist of the Pennsylvania State College, emphasizes use of plants that will not outgrow the space where they are to be set.
