The Great Hoosac Tunnel, Formerly in Egyptian Darkness,

ILLUMINATED BY ELECTRICITY.

An Achievement of the Westinghouse Com-

pany Astonishes the World. FIVE MILES OF ELECTRIC LAMPS

The Westinghouse Electric Company has just finished the contract of lighting the Hoosac tunnel with incandescent lamps, which is regarded as one of the most difficult electric achievements the world has

ever seen. The tunnel is five miles long, and is cut through a mountain ridge, which is filled with numerous springs. When the railroad company decided to cut the tunnel they built two canals, one on each side of the tracks in order to force the water into these channels, so it would run out of the tunnel. They frequently attempted to illuminate tice tunnel with oil, gasoline and gas, but the dampness pervading the air invariably caused the lights to go out, and the tunnel was more or less in Egyptian darkness all the year around. The contract was then offered to several electric ight companies, but none of them desired to ecept it, because it was thought an impossiaccept it, because it was thought an impossi-bility by all electricans to put electric lights into the tunnel. It was argued that the damp atmosphere pervading the tunnel and the water from the walls and roof would so break the electric current that not a light would be of now use. But Mr. Westinghouse was convinced that with a plant constructed according to his methods the task of illuminating the tunnel could be achieved successfully. Contracts were at once drawn up and the preliminary ar-rangements for the work were inaugurated.

SCOFFEES HAVE A LAUGH. The entire electric world laughed at the idea and pooh-poohed it as a quixotic notion. This skepticism grew as the work advanced, and propheses of a dismal failure were heard in this grand electric feat is therefore a remarkande triumph of skill and perseverance.

The work of constructing the line was performed by the Marr Construction Company of Pittsburg, an associated interest of Mr. Westinghouse. The work was personally superinceded by Messra. Thomas Spencer, J. A. Grier, Ed. Davis, Ed. R. Grier and John Staley. Mr. Spencer was recently sent to London, England, to construct a plant of the Westinghouse Electric Company there.

The difficulty of working in the darkness of the trunsel, where torches shed a meagre and uncertain light a distance of a few feet only, can in a measure be imagined. With smoke and constant dripping of water from the roof and sides, the laying of 40 miles of lead-covered cables in a wooden conduit in a ditch on either side of the track was an undertaking requir-

ide of the track was an undertaking requir-ng extreme care and watchfulness. One man was employed all day long to carry oil to the men at work, and there were two barrels of that fluid used every day while the construction of the line was going on. To that trouble was also added the incessant passing trains, of suphurous gases from enganes, corroding all the netal parts from the excessive most ture, and rendering imperative absolutely perfect insulation over 8,000 feet of distance.

This grgantic undertaking was commenced 12 months ago last November and completed two weeks ago. On the 1st of January the machinery was started on a 3 days' trial, one of the conditions of the contract, and if the trial is successful the plant will be given over to the railroad company.

WHAT THE PLANT IS. The machinery consists of two 125-horse power boilers, a 125-horse power engine, three No. 1 Westinghouse alternating current dynamos, each with a capacity of 650 16-candie power lights, and two direct current machines for exciting larger dynamos. This provides for an extra machine in case of accident to either

It has been calculated that in the way of speed the trains will save at least 30 minutes in their passage through the tunnel.
