TROUBLE EXPECTED AT PANAMA.

American Citizens Will Need Protection When Work on the Canal is Suspended.

WASHINGTON, January 16.—Mr. Adams, the United States Consul General at Panama, on the 2d instant received a communication from the Secretary General of the Department of Panama stating that although the local government would do all in its power to preserve peace and order, he feared that disturbances of the public peace might follow the suspension of work on the Panama canal, which suspension is expected soon.

In transmitting this information to the State Department, Mr. Adams says: We appear to be on the verge of a crisis and grave results may be well apprehended.
