There are many people here who see a coracle or know the method of its navigation. The case for the antiquity of coracles is a pretty strong one, for there is evidence of their use by the British in the time of the Romans...

Coracles vary in shape slightly and also in size. There are single and double ones, i. e. to hold one or two persons. The largest size of double coracle weighs about 60 pounds...

THE extreme crankiness of the craft may be inferred from the method of getting into it. You put one leg in, sitting down with the same action, and then draw the other in carefully after.

From no position can river scenery be so well seen as from the coracle. Now the river is a rapid, the water is white with foam, and the banks are steep and rocky.
