THE WELL AND LARBA CLAIMS.

The Claimants Make Demands and Blame Awaited Harrison's Pleas.

WASHINGTON, July 24.—Among the papers that President Harrison has before him, and upon which he may take action while at Deer Park, is a statement from Secretary Blaine respecting the notes of W. H. and I. Z. Larba, claims upon which the Government of Mexico has paid several hundred thousand dollars under the judgment of a commission, before whom the claims were tried after Mexico had paid a portion of the sum awarded, further payment was stopped in the time of Mr. Devol's administration, and the matter was taken up by Congress, upon the plea that the testimony before the Claims Commission was perjured, untrue, and the claims themselves unjust and unfounded.
