## DELEGATES TO WITHDRAW,

#### If Delegate Rees is Admitted, the Council Will Lose Members.

About 20 of the delegates to the Central Trades Council threaten to leave the organization if the delegate from L. A. 491, K. of L., slate roofers, is admitted Saturday night. The members of the local say they do not care whether they have any representation in the courcil or not. They have received their charter and their opponents cannot have it withdrawn. Notwithstanding what they say, the mem-bers of the Federation claim they will demand that the General Executive Board re-call the charter. If this is not done, the matter will be brought officially to the at-tention of the Federation officials. They deny the right of the K. of L. to organize men they struck against.

At the meeting of L. A. 491 resolutions denouncing the persons who stated that the local had been refused a charter were passed. The members of the local assembly will recognize Federation working cards, but the latter will not recognize those of the K of L. K. of L.
