Above the panels is a frieze hung with festoons and garlands of flowers and foliage in most delicate and intricate carving. The posts, brackets, sides and molding are also delicately carved and inlaid. The inside of the lower head and foot panels and side rails are upholstered in pale rose-colored satin thickly tufted, imparting an air of refine

ment and luxury.

The dresser and commode, also of fine proportions, are elaborately carved and inlaid, the front being curved, and top, of satinwood, inlaid with brass and mother-ofpearl. The glass-standard is very rich in carving and inlay, between the upright posts of which swings a large oval, bev-eled-plate mirror.

The mantel and its cabinet is a marvel of

beauty and rich workmanship, in perfect harmony with the furniture here described harmony with the furniture nere described, and is fitted with facings of tecali, or Mexican onyx, and hearth of the same precious material of a pale sapphire tint.
