AN OLD SWINDLE.

A Baited Greenback Passed off on J. L. Masten—Detective Coulson Expects a Flood of Counterfeits.

The green goods business has been probably exhausted in the newspaper reading population of Pittsburgh, and the man who catches another to a back room to purchase \$5,000 for \$200 has gone to New York to solicit subscriptions for the Grand moratorium or to Chicago to fleece the verdant Suckers on a World's Fair project.

ON Friday afternoon the office of J. L. Masten, postmaster at Beltzhoover, was invaded by a placid-looking stranger, who wished to buy a dollar's worth of groceries, which, with registered letters, postage stamps, bills for unpaid tallies and other necessities of life, are to be found in every rural postoffice.

With the ready willingness to accommodate which pervades the Postoffice Department from John Wanamaker down, who might drop his cancelling stamps to show a customer into the ready-made department, the Beltzhoover postmaster showed the way into the grocery sanctum. There the purchase was made, and a \$10 bill handed over as far as appearance concerned.

But appearances are deceitful, and so was the \$10 bill. It was a \$2, the vignette of Major General Hancock on the left-hand side, and the words "Two Dollars" on the right-hand side, and the date of issue, September 13, 1862. The word "Two," engraved on the left-hand side, had all the "2" and the "0" of the "20" erased with a lead pencil, and the figures "10" clipped from revenue stamps, were stuck on over the "2" in every position required.

Detective Sol Coulson has the case in hand, as well as the bill, and says it is as well a made-up "raiser" as he has ever seen, and would be liable to deceive any person taking a bill in a hurry. He thinks that this old species of swindling revived is simply used to pass time away and take attention from dangerous counterfeiters which will stand the inspection of non-experts, and may shortly be sprung on the community.
