LAWS THAT CONFLICT.

A Legal Muddle That May Knock Out Prohibition in Dakota. YANKTON, October 16.—John C. Murray, United States Attorney for Dakota, in an interview bearing upon a question of much interest at this time, says that the enforcement of the prohibitory law may be impossible in South Dakota until three months after the adjournment of the Legislature, and quotes the Constitution, which reads: "No act shall take effect until 90 days after the adjournment of the session at which it passed, unless in case of emergency, to be expressed in the preamble of the body of the act, the Legislature shall, by a vote of two-thirds of all members elected of each House, otherwise provide."

THE K. OF L. DENOUNCED.

The Street Railway Association Rejects, Claiming the Order is Denied. MINNEAPOLIS, October 16.—In the annual convention of the Street Railway Association, begun in this city today, the Executive committee, while a report in which the following references to the Knights of Labor occurred: "The association year now closed has been an almost utter failure of the organization known as the Knights of Labor, so far as at least a portion is concerned which attempted to dominate street railway companies. Starting in with the manifest determination of making a profitable example of one of the members of this association, it declared on the 27th of August a strike which was declared on the 1st of September. Before its conclusion it was accompanied with riot, bloodshed and great suffering. Its extension to New York, taking in every line in that city over which the K. of L. had any control, and westward it took its way until it reached this city. The death knell of the association of Knights of Labor has been sounded because it has shown its want of fitness to live by reason of the crime committed in its name, under direction of its leaders."
