A COLD QUESTION REVIVED. The Ice Dealers Still in a Quandary About Next Summer's Supply.

It is next summer in its warm proportionately as the winter has been this far, every Pittsburg will want a lump of ice to wear in his hat. How to supply this expected demand is causing the cold perspiration to trickle down the vertebrae of the ice dealers...

There is no ice on the upper lakes yet, and the probabilities are that there will be none. Only three times in the last 52 years has Chautauque Lake been open to navigation at New Year's. Such was the case in 1867, 1876 and 1883.

As was published in THE DISPATCH a few days ago the ice companies are considering the advisability of purchasing ice machines to manufacture the luxury. A. A. Hershberger, who is a director in the Chautauque Lake Ice Company until a few weeks ago, said last evening when talking about the scarcity of the winter crop: "It is not improbable that the weather may turn much more favorable to the ice crop than the dealers plenty of ice. If it does not, they will be compelled to buy ice machines, but they will not until they are sure that there will not be a crop of natural ice before making any purchase. The machines are very expensive, but they make even better ice than the natural ice, and they will turn out 100 tons a day would cost \$100,000, and business men will be very chary about investing in such a large sum of machinery which may be almost valueless next winter."
