ADDING TO THE LIBRARY MUDDLE.

Lawyers Advise Keeping the Carnegie Gift Out of Politics.

TWO COMMISSIONES ARE RECOMMENDED

The ordinance placing the Allegheny Carnegie Library in the hands of the City Property Committee will be finally disposed of to-night at the regular meeting of Allegheny Councils. It now turns out that the special legislation secured for Pittsburg, so J. W. WALLACE, 5121 Penn avenus. as to make it possible to accept Mr. Carnegie's proposed gift, applies to Allegheav MCALLISTER & SHEIBLER, Sthav. & Atwood st. as well. The act of May 23, 1887, provides "that it shall be competent for any incorporated city within this commonwealth, and the same is hereby empowered to take and hold any grant or denation of money, books and manuscripts or property, real or personal, for the purpose of establishing a free library within the limits of such corporation, and to make provisions, by annual apriations, for the maintenance of such

ree library. Of course, while this act is in force there is also authority under which the Board of ool Controllers may maintain a library representation on the board having charge of the one.

SUPPORTED BY TAXES. The present library was purchased by the Board of School Controllers and has ever since been maintained by school taxes levied and raised by the board. The posiion of the matter now seems to be that there is in existence one very good library, and the disposition on the part of the City Property Committee is to maintain a second one. which might result in two insufficient insti-

totions.

To maintain both would be a large expense for the taxpayers to meet, as the city would no doubt be compelled to start theirs from the beginning. There is no probability, nor does it appear to be legal for the Board of Controllers to hand over their library absolutely to the city. Since it appears that both bodies have a legal right by acts of Assembly to maintain a library, those who have favored the plan of piacing the new library in the hands of a commission uninfluence, by politics, argue that there is all library in the hands of a commission unin-fluences by politics, argue that there is all the modercason that this course should be adopted, or at least that the Board of Controllers and City Councils should be equally

represented on the commission.

By this means the present library could be merged into the new. By the creation of such a commission as Mr. Carnegie has seen fit to suggest, an end would be put to all controversy, and, it is claimed, the best interest of the city would be subserved.
