# BANKS IN SCHOOLS.

A New Plan Proposed to Teach Children the Value of a Dollar.

SAVING THE PENNIES FOR THEM.

Supt. Luckey Thinks the Schools Are Now Hampered Too Much.

A HARD SCHEME TO WORK IN THIS CITY

The establishment of penny saving funds in some of the schools near Philadelphia, and the probable introduction of the idea in and the probable introduction of the idea in the Quaker City schools themselves has set was too short, and he telegraphed, fixing the Quaker City schools themselves has set people connected with local institutions of learning to thinking. The possibility of having the arrangement copied in this city in the event that the Philadelphia trials should prove successful is thought to be not tar re-mote. The system, or its main points, which are now under consideration by the school authorities in the above mentioned city are as follows: The child desiring to open an account is invinished with a folded card, the inside of which is marked into 36 squares. The rules and regulations of the fund are printed on the out aide of the ticket, which contains, beside the 36 squares, spaces for the signature of the de-positor when closing and opening an account. HOW DEPOSITS ARE MADE. A child that wishes to deposit 1 cent, for in-

A child that wishes to deposit 1 cent, for in-A confid that wishes to deposit 1 cent, for an stance, buys from the teacher or agent of the fond a 1-cent stamp, and the agent sticks the stamp over one of the squares of the card. The stamps are of various denominations, ranging from 1 to 10 cents, and as soon as the card is from 1 to 10 cents, and as soon as the card is filled, or so soon as the amount reaches the sum of \$1 00, the card can be turned in at the cen-tral deposit station of the fund, which is one of the features of the system, and the pupil owning the card is credited with the amount in a deposit book just as a saving's bank receipt for all money given into its care. The money may be drawn at any time by the pupil presenting the card at the place where the stamps were purchased.

purchased. There is no interest paid on deposits, because the money is not inverse paid of deposite, occaning the money is not invested. Another reason is that the cost of printing the cardisand handling the amounts of money is far in excess of the carding power of the small amount deposited. The system is intended to promote the practice remedy for all coughs and colds. The system is intended to promote the practice of economy among children and to teach them the value of pennies. At present even those children who are inclined to put their numer-ous pennies in a bank find no means of doing so except by utilizing the little toy bank at home. This, as is well known, generally acts as a very great temptation to the little ones when they see the amount augmenting until it grows to dollars. While the bank is under their control the many knick knacks which de-light the juvenile eve are prolific excuses for a raid on the institution at short intervals.

#### BENEFITS OF THE PLAN.

The plan suggested above, it is claumed, would imbue the youthful mind with a spirit of importance and pride at having a real bank account. It has been tried at the small city of Chester, just below Philadelphia, and has worked well. The scheme was first introduced in New York City about a year ago, having been copied from a plan now extensively in vogue in many of the schools in Europe, and also being employed in the postal penny savings fund, which does away with all necessity for fund, which does away with all necessity for bookkeeping for sums below \$1.00. Many prominent men in New York were instru-mental in having it introducedand established in this country. It is now in a flourishing con-dition in New York city, although it has never been applied to the public schools of that place. The Charity Organization Society there main-tains it as a branch of the association. A con-tral deposit station is established, and many of the churches, guilds, missions and offices at convenient places are utilized as agencies, where those in charge act as agents, and sell stamps and adminusce the duties appertaining to the scheme. scheme.
