MR. BLAINE CONSOLS THE GREASERS

WASHINGTON, March 12.—Senator Sherman today, in asking the Senate to discharge the Committee on Foreign Relations from further consideration of, and to lay on the table, a memorial of the Fifteenth Legislature of the Territory of Arizona...

Blaine, on the occasion of the presentation of the communication of Senator Mariscal, after stating that the Secretary's request had been left with him the Spanish text and the English translation of Senator Mariscal's note, says: NO THOUGHT OF IT.

"The Secretary of State then informed the Minister that his personal views and those of the United States Government with respect to the annexation of Mexican territory were expressed in his note to Mr. Morgan, the United States Minister at Mexico, dated June 1, 1881, and which was published in the diplomatic correspondence appended to the President's message of that year. He added that the United States Government did not think even remotely of acquiring any portion of the Mexican territory, and that it would not support any project having such an object in view."

"The Secretary of State further stated that the United States Government does not prevent the newspapers or the citizens of this country from saying what they please on that subject; but that, as regards the acquisition of Mexican territory by the United States, he did not believe that any statements made were of importance whatever, since public opinion did not favor further acquisition, and that, even if such a course were pursued, it would be thought that it would meet with no support in this country."
