Secator Voorhees has had several long consultations with Mr. Kincaid, and has marked out the line of defense.

—John Moran, a brakeman of Hokendauqua, Pa, was murdered at the house of Patrick Murphy sesterday. Murphy Moran and Dick Hurley were drunk, and Moran was cut on the bead with a kmfe. Murphy and Hurley deny any knowledge of the murder. Moran leaves a wildow and two children.

-Intelligence has been received from Cabul, -intellirence has been received from Capus, the capital of Afghanistan, that a revolution against Abdurrahman Khan, the Ameer, has broken out in that country. Among those concerned in the report were a number of the courtiers of the Ameer. Several of them were captured by the troops who remained loyal, and were beheaded by the order of the Ameer.

Three Persons Killed and Quite a Number Seriously Injured. TROY, N. Y., March 15,-A calamity, resulting in the death of three persons, occurred in the lower part of the city at 3 o'clock this morning. Tons of clay and moistened earth swept down Warren's Hill and carried before it a double brick house, situated on the east side of Haverman's avenue, about 100 feet south of Washington street. The occupants of the house were 16

in number. The killed are: MRS, JOHANNA HOGAN, aged 40 years, widow. MRS. MARY NOONAN, her mother, aged 88

years.
ANNIE BURNS, grandchild of Patrick Can-Reld, aged II years.

One of the most singular features of the disaster is the fact that all the persons in the building who were not killed outright, ecceeded in extricating themselves from the mortar, bricks and timber unassisted. Before help had arrived they were safe on the street, mingling with the crowd and helping in the search for the buried bodies. The clay bank is hundreds of feet high owering at an angle of 450 from the dwell ings on Haverman's avenue.




