MAIL ROBBERS JAILED.

Eastern Offenders to be Tried Here to-Morrow. Chief Bigelow Will Turn Loose on Mrs. Schenley's Gift To-Day.

United States Deputy Marshal Baring, yesterday, brought William Castleman from Scranton, Pa., and lodged him in jail here to await trial at the May term of the United States District Court on the charge of robbing the postoffice at Nicholson, Pa., on the night of February 6.

Four men broke into the office and rifled about 50 or 60 letters. While they were still in the building they were discovered by Dr. Wheeler, who summoned the police.

The United States officers started on a search, and within three weeks had arrested three men believed to have participated in the robbery. The fourth is still at large.

These arrested were Casteline, Jesse Thomas and Allen Sprague. On February 26 Thomas was arrested, and the officers went to search his father's house at Darlington, Pa. While they were searching the house the prisoner's father took a knife and cut his own throat from ear to ear.

On Tuesday night the officers captured at Scranton and Sprague in Susquehanna county. The three were given a hearing before United States Commissioner Colburn, and on Wednesday they were committed to jail.

The engineer of the engine pushing the coal train on which the robbers escaped from Nicholson, however, identified them as the robbers. The train was on the train. Two of them were his own relatives.

They were held, in default of \$5,000 bail each, for court. Thomas, owing to his father's condition, was not taken to court. Sprague turned State's evidence and was also kept, and Casteline was brought here. They will be tried in the May term of court at Pittsburg.
