Samuel J. Randall Passed Away From Earth.

THE LEADER'S LAST HOURS

A Sorrowing Group Was Gathered Around the Bedside.

DEATH WAS ENTIRELY PAINLESS

Randall's long struggle with death came to an end at 5 o'clock yesterday morning.

WASHINGTON, April 13.—It was a sad and touching scene at the Randall residence on Capitol Hill, when Congressman Samuel J. Randall expired this morning, just as the bells of a neighboring church were tolling 5 o'clock.

Around the bedside were gathered the family, the physician and Postmaster General Wanamaker, who had called a constant watch over the dying man during the night.

A few moments before his death he turned his eyes toward his long suffering wife, said in low tones, "Mother," a word instinct with all the tender recollections of their long and happy married life.

He looked into her eyes as if he were about to say something more, but he seemed to have no strength left, and in a few moments he had passed away. Death had come with the coming of the dawn. The watchers saw that all was over, and the brave wife and daughter, who had nursed and cared for him during his long illness, could restrain their feelings no longer.
