A MURDERER CAPTURED.

Fracturing an Italian's Skull Not Included in His Duties.

His capture was effected by Detectives Downey and Noble, of Detroit, assisted by Chief of Police and Hackett had been employed as a laborer on the natural gas line running into Detroit in the trenches. An Italian was put in work with him who he did not like, and being the frequent quarrels, finally Hackett assaulted him with a shovel, hitting him over the head and crushing his skull. He was removed to the hospital and Hackett fled. The Italian lingered several days, but died. Hackett's whereabouts were discovered by a friend.

SHARING THE PROFITS.

The First Paper Mill to Do So in Pennsylvania.

They then passed through the town and broke open two farm houses south of it. The farmers in the vicinity went to town for assistance, and a party composed of several officers and a half dozen farmers, armed with shotguns, came up with the gang near Marion.

STRIKING THE GUSHERS.

The Butler Field Again Being Tapped for Gas.

The past few days have been so prolific of gushers that some who were predicting the collapse of this field no longer are revising their opinion. J. S. Patterson's No. 6 on the Chas. Young farm, struck the sand last night, making 25 barrels an hour a day. This well is in close proximity to a number of other wells equally as good. Nine new rigs are going up close to the Mur-risville gusher, which is still doing six barrels an hour. The Kanawha Oil Company's No. 4, on the Kanawha farm, struck yesterday and responded by throwing the oil over the derrick.
