That for the purpose of securing a more efficient drainage of the city of Pittsburg the owner or owners of all lots of ground having buildings erected thereon fronting or abutting on any street, lane or alley in said city in which there has been, or may hereafter be, constructed a public sewer opposite such lot or lots, shall construct and maintain at his, her or their own cost an underground sewer connections with such public sewer of not less than nine (9) inches in diameter, and in a careful and safe manner at a place or point upon the lot or lots of such lot or lots, and which said underground sewer all the surface house and other drainage of such lot or lots, and which said underground sewer shall be made and composed of terra cotta pipe, and shall be so placed and constructed and maintained as not to interfere with or injure the use of such public sewer.
