EVOLVING ELECTRIC EMOTIONS.

Making a Man's Face Expressive Without His Knowledge.

ILLUSTRATING ARTISTIC ANATOMY

ing lecture of a course on artistic anatomy, and demonstrated the physiology of the muscles of expression as shown in a living model. Dr. Matson had explained theoretically the action of these muscles, and he now undertook, with the aid of a living model, and an electric battery to demonstrate that expression is dependent upon the action of various muscles, and that these muscles, if set in action without the voluntary aid of the model, would give the desired expression. A life class model now sitting in the school was engaged for the experiment.

TRACING THE MUSCLES.

First, the courses of the various muscles were traced in chalk over the features of the model, who was an elderly man. The work was thus mapped out, and the use of each muscle explained. Next, when the doctor had applied the battery to his own face and the faces of the audience, in order to reas-sure the old man the doctor placed one pole of the battery behind the ear of the subject, and with the other pole touched the muscle to be operated on. Thus without the model having any idea of what his phisiognomy reflected, the great zygomatic muscle could be made to give the expression of laughter to the face. Then by touching other muscles the old man's (see was made to display contempt and discust. The latter expression remained on his face long after the battery had been removed.

THE AUDIENCE ALSO AFFECTED. During the experiments the audience were many times convulsed with laughter at the involuntary grimaces of the By one application he was forced to close his hand, and the effects of the experiment remaining he found it very difficult for a long time to unclinch his fingers. Duchenne, a Frenchman, was the first to

carry experiments of this nature to any degree of success. He secured for a subject, on old paralyzed army pensioner, whose fa was almost insensible to any emotion. Electricity could be applied to this man without producing any painful reaction. This is the first time that the experime has been performed in America.
