Water Supply.

Colonel Roberts on Its Feasibility and the

SOME IDEA OF THE COST OF BUILDING

The Pennsylvania Canal Commission met in the rooms of the Engineers' Society yesterday. It was the regular monthly gathering. Engineer Goodwin, who has charge of the survey, was present and made a report of the progress. It was expected that the survey from Erie to the Ohio river at Rochester would be completed by the time the meeting was held, but ten miles yet remain to be gone over. This work will be finished in a

The commission decided to continue the survey up along the Ohio river to the Dawis Island dam. Colonel Roberts will recommend that the canal be built to the dam. He says the proposed dam at Beaver only provides for a six-fact stage of water, and the draught of the canal will probably be not less than nine feet. As soon as the survey to the city is completed, a map of the canal and the region will be prepared. It will require a few months longer to complete this job, and the commission will re-port to the Legislature next winter.

A PRACTICAL SCHEME. "What shall be the size of the canal is the next question to settle," said Colonel Roberts yesterday. "If we knew how large it would be then I could give an estimate as

it would be then I could give an estimate as to the cost. As it is now, I have my own ideas, but I don't care to make any blunders. The original idea was to build a canal large enough to float a 1,500-ton vessel. I shouldn't like to see it so small that a barge with 1,100 tons on beard could not be carried. Of the feasibility of the canal the commission has been convinced long age. If we thought it was impracticable in the beginning, the surveys would never have been made.

"The people who claim that the water supply on the summit is not sufficient, should prove their statements. I have repeatedly said there is a sufficiency of water to run the canal; in fact, the supply will be larger than the slack water in the Monongahela river. I stand over this statement, and I have the reports of other engineers to confirm me, so that the men who decry the water supply should demonstrate the

decry the water supply should demonstrate the truth of their assertions. The summit of the canal is a great swamp, and it can be easily

"Besides, the canal will run through a number of water routes that have already been made, and this will greatly lessen the cost of construction. With the improved machinery of these days for dredging, the work will not be as difficult as some people imagine. I can say

ns difficult as some people imagine. I can say this, that, in looking over the ground, that all the masoury will be such that it can be done at the regular rates."

Secretary Brewer, of Erie, is also more enthusiastic than ever for the canal. He doesn't claim to knew anything about the practical workings of the scheme, but he is convinced that the canal is feasible. He also insists that it will be a cheap waterway to build. He thought if the Beaver dam was ever built that it might furnish enough water between Pittsburg and that point to fisat the canal craft, and it wouldn't be necessary to run it to Davis Island dam.

He left in the afternson to go to Bochester, where he expected to meet his men. After go-ing over the ground he told Secretary Brewer that there never was a canal built of any consequence in which the cost of construction will be as low as in the Pennsylvania canal between Pittsburg and Erie.
