A pretty discussion is going the rounds upon the question: "Does this playing without notes?"

The Musical Herald, in raising the issue, points to the mental and nervous strain usually incident to playing by note...

Note that this is a question of means, not of ends. All true artists aim at the same thing—a conveyance to the listener with the least possible effort and maximum effect...

These are really side issues, however. The true point is whether or not the use of notes does distract the player's attention from the music itself...

That depends primarily upon the individual player's organization. It cannot be concealed by any means that "a proper musical instinct" invariably implies a faculty for memorizing and playing from memory...

Another aspect of the question may be touched upon. Mr. Lavallee objects to a player's reflection will show that this is just what they ought to do...

The noblest quality in an interpretative artist is an entire absorption with the notes he renders of himself to the composer.

It would seem, too, as if the sight of the printed page would, by association, materially aid the player in a varied procedure to make the proper frame of feeling for the composition...

Mr. Frank E. Saddler of this city, would seem to have been studying musical theory at Munich to some purpose...

It is two parts for violin, written on the violin staff, with these two parts are brought up and down and played back and forth...

These two parts are written at right angles, crossing each other, and when played forward and backward by two violins, viola and cello, constitute a quartet.

DISOBEYED ORDERS. Two Miners at the Massillon Coal Company's Mine Fatally Injured. (SPECIAL TELEGRAM TO THE DISPATCH.) MASSILLON, June 21.—Mark Johns and Jacob Ringling, miners, disregarded the orders of the mine boss at the West Massillon Coal Company's No. 1 to-day by going into an abandoned room, from which the props had been taken, to get their tools. The roof caved in and the men were crushed in under solid stone by 12 feet of timber in possession. They had beside over \$300 in good American and French money.
