

EIGHT MILLIONS IN IT.
Wrought Iron Pipe Manufacturers Form a New Organization
TO CONTROL OIL COUNTRY TRADE.
The Amalgamated Association Nearing an Adjustment.
RAILWAY EMPLOYEES WANT MORE PAY

An important meeting of men representing 14 of the most prominent wrought iron pipe manufacturers in the United States was held at one of the city hotels yesterday, for the purpose of organizing what is to be known as an oil country organization, to operate in conjunction with the Wrought Iron Pipe Manufacturers' Association. The Pittsburgh firms represented were the Pittsburgh Tube Company, the National Tube Works Company, the American Tube and Iron Company, the Pennsylvania Tube Company, the Oil City Tube Company and the E. W. Ryan & Co. There were several Eastern manufacturers represented, and the total capital represented was not less than \$8,000,000. The meeting was a secret one, and although the people who attended it were aware of what was about it, it was known only to those who were present.

In explaining the objects of the organization, one of the men present said that it is intended to prevent irregularities and to preserve such commercial conditions in the trade as may be necessary for the benefit of the oil country. It is claimed that the business as it is handled by the present organization is an organization of the character proposed, and that the oil country trade, being of local interest, can be controlled more effectively if it were referred to the Manufacturers' Association.

The new organization will have headquarters in Pittsburg and will be composed of independent oil and gas trade. It will be composed of manufacturers, their representatives and independent oil and gas men. It will be organized upon a similar one which was operated in the oil country, which was organized several years ago. The manufacturers who attended yesterday's meeting are enthusiastic about the proposed organization, and they are confident that it will be a great benefit to them. Those who were not there have indicated their interest in the organization, and they are planning to meet in the near future.

MAY CLOSE THE SESSION TO-DAY.
The Amalgamated Association is nearing an adjustment of its differences with the railroad employers. There is a possibility of the Amalgamated Association being able to adjourn to-day. It is certain the session will not last over to-morrow. The delegates are getting very tired of the long session, and they are anxious to get away. The report of the Ways and Means Committee was heard and disposed of yesterday.

THE HOME FOR COLORED CHILDREN.
An Appeal From the Manager to a Generous Public. Perhaps but few charitably disposed people in Allegheny or Pittsburg are aware of the existence of the Home for Colored Destitute Children, one of the few institutions of the country devoted to this problem. Indeed we may further say that with the exception of a similar home in Philadelphia, we know of no other in the State. The Home is situated at the foot of Greenwood avenue, Allegheny, and was established for the maintenance, education and training of needy colored children. The institution was organized in 1880, and for many years donated by the community. A few friends who contributed to its support. Three years ago the State recognized the usefulness of the Home, and since then has appropriated a large amount of money. For some years a portion of the "Avery Fund" was given to it for the needs of the children, but two years ago it was withdrawn for use in a training school. We care for from 50 to 60 children in the Home, and the ages range from 1 year to 12. While with us they are taught the rudiments of a common school education, and are also trained in domestic and manual arts. Each child is provided with suitable homes for the children when 12 years old, but in case we cannot succeed we are obliged to keep them longer. Owing to want of money we have been compelled to refuse admission to a number of worthy applicants. We are told that the colored Home has not been properly placed before the public, and that many liberal people have not fully known of its existence and the good that would be done. We regret that this should be so, and can only hope that all good people interested in this work will visit us or otherwise investigate our methods and aims.
