WASHINGTON, July 3.—The Senate today again considered the postal and ship subsidy measures. Mr. Vest continued his argument against the bills.

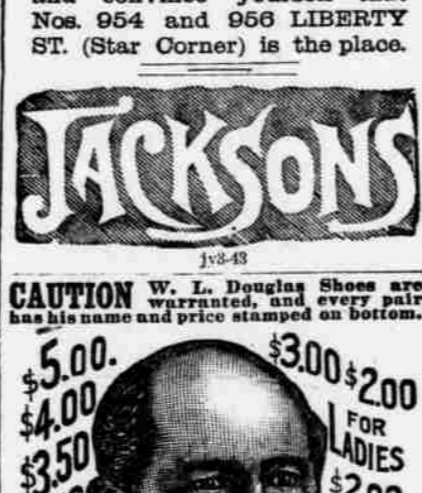
