the least. All that is necessary is to have the muzzles properly made with broad straps around the neck. The owners of good dogs

around the neck. The owners of good dogs are well pleased with such an order, because it is more safe for their own dogs to run about when the curs are killed." J. D. Brown, Esq., was interviewed yes-terday regarding the legal right of Chief Brown to issue his order against dogs. He said.

"There is an act of Assembly giving the right to any corporate organization, town, or city, to regulate or prohibit by ordinance the running at large of all dogs, cattle or other animals. In accordance with this act the city of Pittsburg passed an ordinance to the effect that all dogs must be muzzled from July 15 to September 15.

BEFORE & MAGISTRATE.

"All dogs found running at large without muzzles must be taken before an Alderman or Magistrate, and on proof of the dog being dangerous or without an owner it must be shot. It also provides that the Mayor has power to appoint as many men as he deemed cessary to carry out this ordinance, and they are to be paid by warrants drawn on the City Treasurer. It further provides that any person interfering with an officer in any person interfering with an officer in . Washington, D. C., Baltimore and Phila-taking charge of a dog is liable to a fine of delphia, on Thursday, July 17, 1890; tickets

taking charge of a dog is finite to a line of defining, on intraday, only 14, 1000; tickets good for each offense.
"The ordinance also implies that the officers must use judgement in the matter. They cannot shoot dogs promisenously. I think Chief Brown's order is in necordance
B. & O. R. R. depot at 8 A. M. and 9:20 p. both with the State and city legislation. I do not believe that Mr. Brown intends that policemen have the right to shoot Alogs down. They have not the right to go into a man's yard and take out a dog because he is not muzzled. The proper way would be to serve notice on the owner, and then proceed if no attention is paid. I do not think Chief Brown's order conflicts with the law in any way.
