## FOR AN INFIRMARY

A Case Turned Up in Which the Need of a Hospital is Shown;

WEST PENN AND CITY FARM FULL

City Treasurer Denniston Says the City Should Have One,

OR ELSE PAY FOR ITS PATIENTS

A case of distress, showing the necessity for a city infirmary, turned up in City Treasurer Denniston's office yesterday afternoon. A young woman, about 19 or 20 years of age, applied to the Major for a permit to enter the West Penn Hospital. Owing to the crowded condition of the institution, Major Denniston sent her to Chief Elliot, of the Department of Public Charities, who could not do anything for her and sent her back to Major Denniston. The latter thought of the hospital overcrowded with charity patients, but had not the heart to turn the girl away again. He gave her a card of admission, and the poor creature had a roof over her head last night.

The girl is an orphan and has been a house servant all her life. She is troubled with epileptic fits, and on account of this cannot get a situation. When she applied to Major Denniston for admission to the West Penn, she said she had no money and needed medical treatment.

AN OVERCROWDED POOR FARM. When she applied to Chief Elliot the latter informed her that the Poor Farm Hospital had more people at it now than could be taken care of. If it hadn't been for Major Denniston's assistance, the girl would probably have had to apply to the police authorities for a night's lodging. Chief Elliot bits the nail squarely on the bead in THE DISPATCH to-day in his remarks

about a city infirmary," said Major Denniston. "What we need here is a place where beople can be temperarily cared for when they are iil. In the case of this girl she needs about three weeks of meelical treatment. I sent her to Chief Elliot, who sent her back to me, and the only thing I could do was to send her to the hospital. "The West Fenn is about \$99,000 in debt, and every charity patient we take in puts us further in the hole. The city levies a tax to maintain such cases as this, but nothing could be done for her by the Department of Charities. The city does not give us a cent for taking charge of these people. Last year 77 per cent of the people in our hospital were charity patients. We get them from the mills, workshops and railroads, and they do not pay a cent for their treatment. The West Penn does more good in this way than any hospital in the city, and I doubt if there are any in the State to equal it. Last year, the Department of Charities had more money than it had use for. If \$6 or \$7 per week was paid for each city patient, this money could not only have been used to good advantage, but would help us out of debt.
