ANKAN, SCOTLAND, August 8.—Complete as is the identification of the man Burns with place, scene and memorial in old Dumfriesshire, there is a far more pleasant association to be found between Burns the poet-farmer, Burns the poet-farmer-Excise-man, Burns the poet-Excise-man, and the lovely valley of the Nith.
