Pointment to commission men in Washington in over-shipment of week. Quality and size are all that can be desired.

There is a short supply of choice apples and potatoes, and markets are firm for stock.

Tomatoes are plenty and cheap. Grapes are in good supply and quality of receipts improves.

The first Niagara grapes of the season have appeared within a day or two, and are good stock.

Light receipts of a basket and poultry are firm at a shade better prices than have prevailed for a few days past.

In single cases choice nearby eggs sold this morning at 20c per dozen. Ohio chickens, very firm at potatoes and likely to go higher.

Fancy creamery brings the outside price, but the cash buyer has paid more than the market price. The price up to this morning was 20c per pair, or is now 20c per pair.

THE MARKET BASKET. Advance in Dairy Products and Eggs—Oleo Makes Its Appearance—Tomatoes Cheap—Fish Very Scarce—Prices of Staples.

The features of the week as to the kitchen market are: cheap advance in milk, cream and reliable eggs. Fancy creamery butter is from 1c to 1 1/2c higher in a jobbing way than it was a week ago.

The effect of bringing from its hiding place large quantities of watermelons, which have touched their lowest point this season within a few days and which are the cheapest vegetable in the market, has been having a good effect.

Watermelons are also very plenty, and are very much improved in size and quality. The quality of grapes on the market has also very much improved, and there was wide room for those offered so far this season.
