(CORRESPONDENCE OF THE DISPATCH.) YETHOLM, SCOTLAND, August 21. I always love to come to Yetholm. It is a sweet, old, out-of-the-way spot, like a meadow lark's nest in one of Scotland's shining border lands.

The valley of Yetholm itself is enchanting enough without its tinge and flavor of true Gipsydom. On all sides rise the noble Cheviot Hills, more beautiful and more charming in reality than anywhere painted in old border minstrelsy.

Overshadowing Yetholm itself are six noble hills of the Cheviot, Sherburn, Stamergh, Galdenout, Green Hamilton, Harlaw and Great Vence, hiding from the hamlet the billowy, verdure-clad reaches of English Northumbrian valleys.

YETHOLM GIPSY SETTLEMENT. This is old Yetholm. Winding out of its breast side underneath a shadowy vaulting of trees, a pleasant way leads across Howmounth vale, where the river, the very water of life, occurs the fiercest struggle.

Gipsies stole into Scotland from Ireland about the year 1200. So consummately shrewd were they in carrying out their scheme of pillage under the leadership of Antonius Gawain, Earl of Little Egypt, and of being under command of the pastor of the heathen Romyany, that they were able to keep their eyes on the prize.

MORE STRINGENT LAWS. In 1699 another act enforcing all previous statutes bearing on the gipsies, and severely condemning the negligence of justices and commissioners in not putting previous laws against them into execution.

FAMOUS ROMANY POLK. The most noted of the Scotch Gipsies were the Anthonies, the original chief and leader, the Dalrymples, afterward the Baillies, from whom the many families of American Gipsy Baillies are descended.
