### IMPROVED LOCKS.

Application of Hydraulic Pressure to Expedite Canal and River Navigation.

The display of Arthur Kirk & Son, which is at the east end of Machinery Hall, deserves careful study. A large working model 28 feet long, 12 feet wide and 10 feet deep plainly demonstrates how it is possible to avoid the greater part of the delays necessitated by the generally used system of locks in canal and river navigation.
