When William Henry Smith, General Manager of the Associated Press, was in Pittsburg last week, he went to Washington, Pa., to see W. W. Smith, a prominent banker of that place and a cousin of General Grant, to get some data tor a political history he is writing of the war times. During the conversation the newspaper man remarked that Western Pennsylvania had figured prominently in the history of the country, and he feit confident there were a number of old documents, relies, etc., lying around loose that, if gathered together and preserved, would make a very interesting collection. He wanted to know why a fire proo building was not erected somewhere and such a collection made.

Mr. Smith, of Washington, has entertained such a plan for quite a while, but he is anxious to have the building put up on the Washington and Jefferson campus, and to be conducted in connection with that in-

Mr. Smith's idea is to make a collection of relios, ancient accounts, diartes, the correspondence of public men and their opinions on current topics of their times, or anything else that would throw light on the histing else that would throw light on the hi

Recently in tearing down an old house in Fayette county some valuable papers belonging to Albert Gallatin, one of the pioneers in Western Pennsylvania and a prominent man n his day, were found between the walls. How they got there is a mistery.
