PARIS, October 18.—There has been great excitement during the week at Lyons over the new United States tariff law, and M. Bourdeau, the Lyonese Deputy, has given notice that he will, in the Chamber, demand retaliation for the increased duties on French goods. He will especially propose that a retaliatory duty be placed on petroleum, and will suggest that boards of inspection be established for the examination of all imports from the United States.

PHILADELPHIA, October 18.—A conference meeting of prominent business and professional men of this city, who are friends of the Brooks license law and favor keeping the power of granting liquor licenses in the hands of the Judges and not an Excise Board or Commission, was held in the lecture room of the Young Men's Christian Association, Fifteenth and Chestnut streets, yesterday.

HE WAS SURPRISED.

The Spanish Minister Not Officially Notified of His Reported Recall. WASHINGTON, October 18.—Don Emilio De Mirava, the Spanish Minister to this country, was somewhat surprised yesterday when questioned as to the truth of the story that he had been recalled by his Government. "Many changes are impending in the personnel of the diplomatic corps in Spain," he replied, "but I have not yet received a letter of recall, though I would not be at all surprised to receive such a summons. During my stay in Washington, I have been treated very kindly by all the officials with whom I have been brought in contact, and I am rather gratified by the manner in which I am treated here."

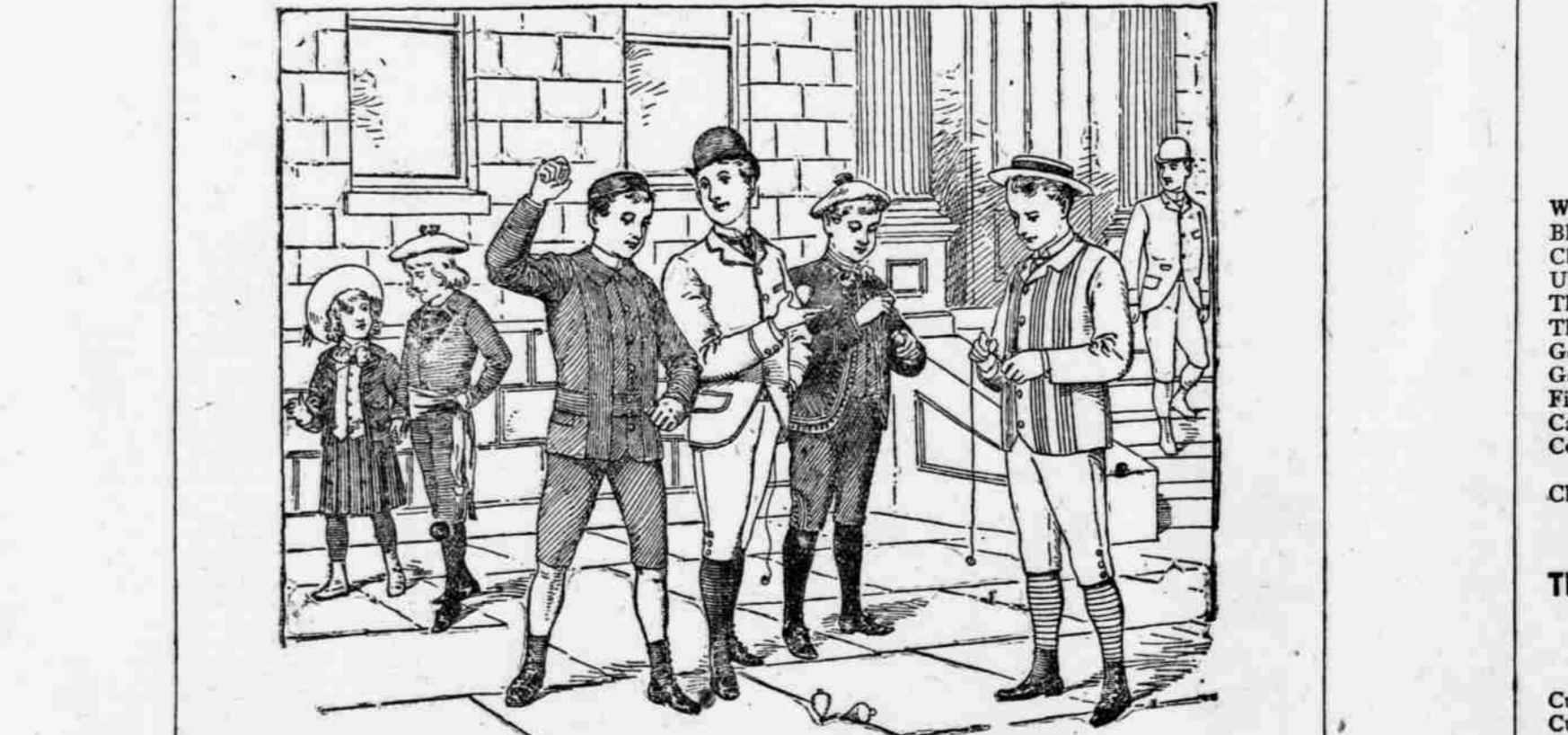
