A comparison of the condition of the blast furnaces of the country for the last month puts Pittsburg in the lead by an average weekly output of over 10,000 tons. These furnaces use charcoal, anthracite and coke, and of the charcoal furnaces there are more

In the charcoal list there have been no changes in Pittsburg, while with the anthra- Of every description and price from 10c upcite furnaces, the Pennsylvania Steel Company's Spiegel furnace has resumed the making of iron, and the St. Charles No. 2 black and fancy colors, at 50c, worth 6234c. has been finally abandoned. Among those No. 2—Something entirely new in an Enusing coke in this district, all of the furnaces in the Edgar Thomson plant are in blast; yesterday. Soho went out last Friday.

Of the total weekly capacity of 124,059 tons in all the furunces, Pittsburg turns out as her share 25,125, or more than one-fifth of all other furnaces in the United States. During the last month five furnaces have been added, with a total increase in capacity of 3,672 added, with a total increase in capacity of 3,672 tons. Pittsburg has 18 furnaces in blast and four out of blast. These latter have a weekly capacity of 4,286 tons.

In this connection it may be noted that a number of the furnacemen are complaining about the stiff price asked for coke. It is selling for \$2.15, a rate which it has maintained for the last five or six months, and as the prices have been fixed for November, there will not likely be pay change for two or three weeks. Furnacimen argue that they cannot see the propriety of holding up prices on the basis of \$20 to \$21 pig iron, when the price of the latter has dropped to \$15.50.
