THE ALIBI TESTIMONY. Webster Mains was the first witness yesterday. He saw Myers on the 15th of May, at 12:20 o'clock driving in toward McKeesport in a two-horse wagon.

MEMORY OF MYERS' PARTNER. T. F. Van Kirk was the next witness, and as he approached the stand there was considerable excitement. Mr. Van Kirk stated that for the past three weeks he has been employed as manifest clerk at the Homestead office of the Pittsburgh and Lake Erie Railroad.

WHERE THE SHELL WAS FOUND. Albert Kuhn was present in the room when the shell was found by Packer in the middle of the room, under the carpet. The two men had just gotten the revolver from Mr. Van Kirk.
